

N.C.W.Q.G. Raffle Block January 2006

Block is 9" finished

Read all instructions and use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams

Background (given fabric)

Cut 1- $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square

Cut 4- 2" squares

Main fabric (red or Pink)

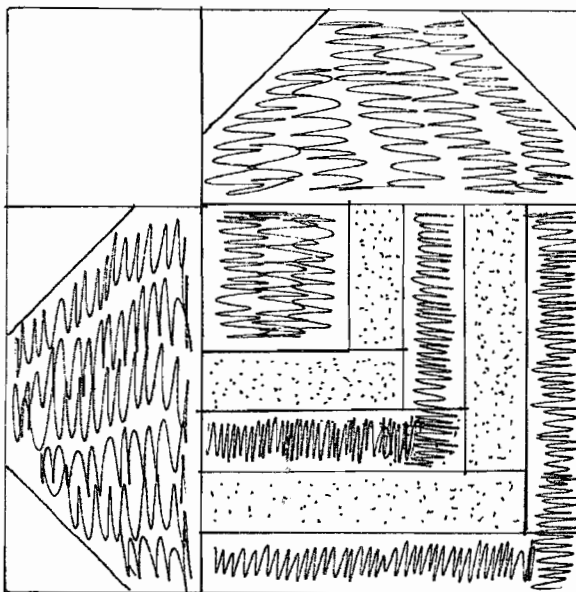
Cut 2- Rectangles $3\frac{1}{2}$ " X $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut 1- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square

Cut strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide by
 $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", $5\frac{1}{2}$ ", $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Contrasting fabric

Cut strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide by
 $2\frac{1}{2}$ ", $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", $4\frac{1}{2}$ ", $5\frac{1}{2}$ "



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 4 2" squares. Place on the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " X $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles being careful to note the direction of the drawn line. Sew on the line. Press. Trim away the 2 under fabrics leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

Take the 2" square (main fabric) and a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " by $2\frac{1}{2}$ " piece of contrasting fabric sew together. Press.

Follow the picture and sew the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " piece to the bottom. Then do the same with the main color pieces. Then the contrasting fabric and finally the last two pieces of main fabric. This piece will measure $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Following the picture sew one of the rectangles to the left side of the square. Take the other rectangle and sew the white square $3\frac{1}{2}$ " to it. Sew this to the top of the block. Press.

There you are all finished, now isn't that pretty?
