Terry Hunter and I are excited to begin the New Year and hit the ground running. We have lots of plans to make another great Harvest of Quilts Show in October. We are still looking for a few good women to fill some fun positions, so please consider joining us in our quilt show endeavors.

The first position I need to be filled is for the Merchant Mall Chair Person. This involves initial contact with possible vendors for the show and the subsequent follow-up. We have a list of past vendors and plenty of good prospects for new ones. Vendor fees are collected, tracked and positions assigned on show layout. During the show the chairperson is available for questions, assistance, booth layout and troubleshooting. This is a position with lots of social interaction.

We are also looking to fill the Admissions Chair. This job mostly takes place during the Quilt show. It involves set-up of the admissions table and area, scheduling volunteer sign-ups for two days and overseeing them. This requires handling money but not obtaining or tracking it. Lastly, we need one person or a group to take on the construction and planning of the 2011 Raffle Quilt. This involves planning, drafting (if necessary), fabric purchase and directing the construction through to the quilting and binding.
