2012 Programs

January 18, 2012-We will be getting to know Donald Larson and his quilts. Donald will share his quilting history, his current work and a peek at his sewing room.

February 22, 2012-Linda Riesterer and Louise Brown will talk about what makes a great quilt show. They will explain all the many jobs involved and review the last show.

March 28, 2012- Dee Howie will do a program on working with wool. She will show a variety of techniques and supplies to use on your wool work. We will be showing some fabulous examples of wool quilted projects and if you have something to share please bring it along.



Quilt Show

As you know, I have sent out a survey to get your input about the future of the quilt show. (If you haven't returned yours yet, please do. We still want to know what you think). I will share the results of that at the February guild meeting. Many of you took the time to write thoughtful comments and some of you raised the same issues that concerned me when I took on the chairmanship of the show for 2012. I think it might be helpful to explain some of the background work that has been done in this newsletter so that we all have the same information.

I, too, was concerned with the expense of renting the Town Toyota Center, so I took a serious look at other venues.

The Chelan County Fairgrounds in Cashmere has a large building, but the lighting is very poor and I don't think there is any way to get the floor clean enough so that there wouldn't be a lot of dust raised by people walking around looking at quilts. In addition, I think attendance would be reduced if people had to drive that "far" out of Wenatchee. Also, the ground around the fairgrounds is uneven and might present walking problems for some people.

Wenatchee High School commons and entry area (the gyms are not available). There would be room for the quilts and vendors, but probably not for demonstration and bed turning areas. In addition the show would have to be changed to early summer and the High School could not guarantee it would be available every year, depending on the building's maintenance needs. There would be security issues as most high school employees have access to the building at any time and the building would only allow district employees to serve as security—and that would depend on if anybody wanted the job.

Performing Arts Center, where we used to have the show, has a nice area upstairs, but there are scheduling problems. They will not allow us to book more than 6 months in advance and will not guarantee the same weekend every year. This makes it very hard to advertise and schedule vendors. In addition, the Center will bump us from the upstairs room if something better for them comes along—they can make more money from something like a wedding reception that serves food and drink. In that case we are sent to the downstairs and have the quilt show broken up into several rooms, and crowding the vendors.

I did not look specifically at any churches. I am not aware of any with a large enough area and I don't think many would be willing to give over their facility to us for 3 days just before a Sunday. The Grange Halls I have visited are not nearly big enough.

That brings us back to Town Toyota Center. I have concluded (somewhat to my surprise) that this is our best choice as a venue. I think almost everyone agrees the facility is very nice and allows us to have a very classy quilt show. Terry Hunter and the quilt show committee last year did an excellent job in reducing expenses. Costs for the 2011 show increased by only .08% as compared with over 30% in some of the previous years. I met with the Town Toyota Center events and facilities managers and they had some suggestions for ways to save money and increase ticket sales. The Quilt Show Committee will be discussing these and bring any feasible ideas to the guild membership.

I hope this answers some questions you may have and I look forward to sharing the survey results at the February Guild meeting.

Quilt Show CD's

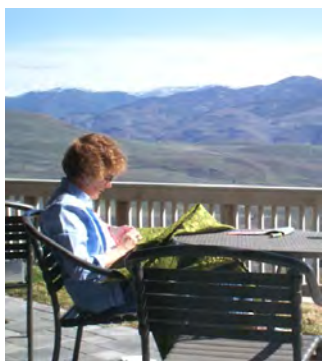
If you want to purchase a CD of the 2011 Quilt Show, please pay \$10 at the January meeting. Only prepaid orders will be filled.

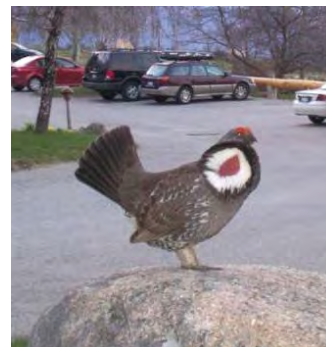


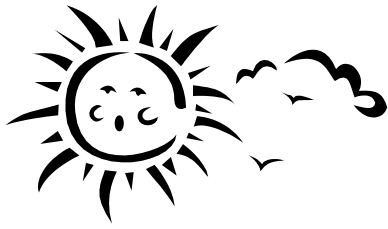
Geraldine enjoys hand-stitching on the deck overlooking the beautiful Methow Valley.

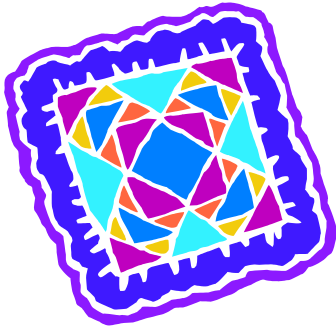
