President's Corner

November 6, 2011

Dear Quilters,

I have enjoyed writing these letters and sharing with you interesting information and history regarding the craft of quilting. A topic that I see developing in our quilt world is the branching out of our unique quilt designs into community spaces such as sidewalks and buildings. The town of Kalona, Iowa installed 42 brick quilt blocks this summer in sidewalks downtown. (www.kalonaiaowa.org) what a beautiful way to enhance your community. The AccuQuilt Company held its 2nd Annual Barn Quilt Unveiling in June and hung the winning block design as a 17'x17' (yes that's feet!) on the side of their company's offices in Fremont, Nebraska. Second place winner had a 6'x6' block hung there as well. (www.accuquilt.com). There are 28 states that now have what they call Quilt Trails, maps and guides to locate quilt designs on barns and buildings all over their communities. This all began in 2001 in Adams County, Ohio, when Donna Sue Groves painted a quilt design on the family's barn to honor her mother, an avid quilter. Eleanor Burns has written a new book Quilt Blocks on American Barns that pays tribute to these barns, with patterns to sew. You can take photo tours of these wonderful designs on www.barnquilts.com and www.americanquiltbarns.com. Washington State is not on the Quilt Trails map, but I think we should start organizing ourselves. These communities offer advice on how to get started. I grew up in south eastern Pennsylvania where all of the barns had Hex signs painted on them, to protect their livestock and ward off danger and ensure a bountiful crop. I think that our quilt blocks hold similar power; they represent faith and family, and illustrate the toils and follies of our lives. We may not have an abundance of barns in our valley, but some of the towns erected freestanding quilt "billboards" in parks and gardens, they hung designs on walls and fences, and on churches and hospitals. I noticed at our Quilt Show that the Brush Benders, our local artists that paint those wonderful knobby cypress knees, were also selling painted quilt blocks on large squares of masonite. I think we should form a committee and get started! The Washington State Tourism Board should be our partner, they could help us locate sites, the artists could help paint, and we could offer our beautiful designs.

2011 has been dubbed "The Year of the Quilt" and I'm proud to be a Quilter.

2011 Harvest of Quilts, 'Our Valley's Harvest' – Wrap-Up

Over 900 visitors enjoyed two sun-filled Fall days and nearly 300 amazing quilts at the 2011 Harvest of Quilts, 'Our Valley's Harvest,' last month at the Town Toyota Center. When our guests arrived, they were greeted by the sight of our raffle quilt and the sound of beautiful harp music. They were treated to shopping with vendors inside the area and on the concourse and had the opportunity to meet our sponsors. They voted for their favorite quilts in all categories and enjoyed lunch and maybe even a mocha as they took in the show. All in all, the Quilt Show was deemed a success.

Here are a few statistics that everyone is anxious to hear: the quilt raffle brought in over \$3,200; the silent auction - \$770; boutique - \$2800; admissions – over \$4,800; and sponsors/vendors - \$8,660. Some of these amounts are actually still changing (believe it or not!), as are the expenses related to the show. However, we are able to report that, even after the Quilt Show Account of \$10,000 has been replenished, we are able to provide the Guild with over \$5,400!

I'd like to thank the incredible Quilt Show Committee Chairs for their work, insight, creativity and on-going support throughout this past year. Life has its challenges, and I could write a book about that! I know most of you did a lot more than what is listed here. Thank you, everyone, for your fine work and for the help of all our volunteers. What a wonderful group of people to work with throughout the year.

As always, we learned new things and I know Linda is already incorporating those into her plans for next year. Our concern about the need for more volunteers continues, and you will be hearing more about that as the year progresses. It's not too early to think about what you'd like to do to help prepare for next year...and you can think about that while you're working on next year's quilt entry!

2012 QUILT SHOW REPORT FROM CHAIR LINDA RIESTERER

It is never too early to think about the next NCW Quilt Show! We have some new things planned, like a "First Timer" category for entering a quilt. More details will come later. Right now we need to fill a few committee chair positions. Many of last year's chairs agreed to take the same job this year, but there are opportunities for people who want to get involved to step forward. Openings include:

White Glove—schedule people to work 2 hour shifts, walking the floor at the show, answering questions, and offering people who want to touch the quilts a glove. This would be a great job for someone who wants to get involved and meet guild members.

Live Demos—schedule people to give a demonstration for the public during the show. Demos can be 10-30 minutes long and can be about any quilting topic.

Have you taken some good classes or have friends who are experts in some aspect of quilting? Ask them to do a demo!

**Raffle Quilt Ticket Sales and Display—Schedule with area quilt shops to display the raffle quilt and have tickets on hand to sell. Arrange to have the tickets printed (there is lots of help on how to do this.) Assign groups of tickets to guild members to sell and take money from tickets sold. Organize people to sell tickets at local events like the Leavenworth Quilt Show.

Laundress—Pick up the soiled drapes and sheets after the quilt show, launder and fold them, put them back into their plastic tubs. Call show chair to pick up the tubs to take to the storage unit. All of the drapes do not have to be washed—usually only about one tub full gets dirty.

Silent Auction—Contact 10 of our quilt artists and request they make a quilt for the silent auction. Supervise the bidding and collect the bid money at the show.

**Computer Guru—We need someone with computer graphics skills to work with marketing and advertising to design the show poster and "save the date" bookmarks. Once the design is done, the other chairs can arrange for the printing. In addition, this may involve making some forms and setting up spreadsheets for some of the other show chairs. This would be a great job for someone who works and can't spend a lot of working-hour time helping with the Guild. If you have these skills, please volunteer.
