12" Finished (12 1/2" unfinished)

Please **do not trim** your block when you are finished with it. This will allow the winner of the blocks a bit more leeway in putting the blocks together.

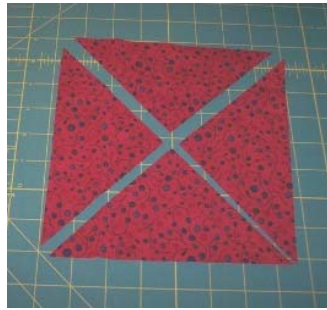
A triangle has three angles and three sides, and that means at least one edge of every triangle is cut along the fabric's stretchy bias. **Handle triangles carefully to avoid stretching them out of shape. Be careful when pressing.**

Medium fabric (C) **provided**: Cut two 6 7/8" squares in half diagonally.

Dark fabric (B): Cut one 7 1/4" square

Light fabric (A): Cut one 7 1/4" square

Cut fabric A & B squares diagonally from corner to corner. Without moving the resulting triangles, line up the ruler and make another diagonal cut in the opposite direction. Each square will yield four quarter-square triangles.



1) Layout triangles in block design.

2) Sew fabric A & B triangles together .



3) Sew triangles formed by fabric (A) & (B) to (C) triangles to make four 6 1/2" squares.



4) Sew squares together to form block. Press these seams open to reduce bulk at center of block.
