## President's Corner

Greetings Quilter Friends,

August is quilt washing month-the perfect time to have an 'olde-fashioned airing". Yes, those wonderful quilts and throws you're making can be washed, and there is a science to it that has been developing for thousands of years. The oldest record of washday appears in 2,000 BC wall paintings in the Egyptian tombs. One depicts men bending over the wash, two scrubbing fabric, two folding, while two more twist the fabric to dry it. Phoenicians discovered that by mixing goat's tallow with wood ashes they could clean their clothes better-they created a surfactant that reduced the surface tension of water and held the dirt in suspension. The Celts called this saipo, from which "soap" is derived. I like to wash my wool quilts by hand, but it takes two of us to carry the basket outside and lift the water logged quilt high enough to pin it to the clothesline. (Clothespins and cloths lines-two more marvelous inventions!)

Proctor and Gamble built an empire on Tide. Print ads followed the lives of families that used Ivory Soap. Radio shows in 1933 introduced "washboard weepers", 15 minute plots sandwiched between Oxydol commercials. By the time the show was cancelled in 1956 they had ushered in the soap opera.

Ever hear of Subtilisin? This natural enzyme will eat the sweat right out of your socks. Its job is to eat protein in dirt as part of the rotting process. Scientists discovered enzymes added to detergent produce cleaner laundry. But with natural fibers like wool and silk, you must heed those warning label such as, hand wash, no bleach, no detergent, mild soap. Bleach helps to remove dirt from white fabric, but mostly it turns the stain colorless. Those yellow stains on your white undershirt armpits are from Squalene, human body oil that didn't quite come clean. Bleach will disintegrate wool! For those of you with antique, well-loved quilts, there are now excellent products that will safely remove those stains with out doing more damage.

So Happy Wash day to all of you, whether you're at home, in a Laundromat or down at the river! Sincerely, Kathy Baker NCWQG President
