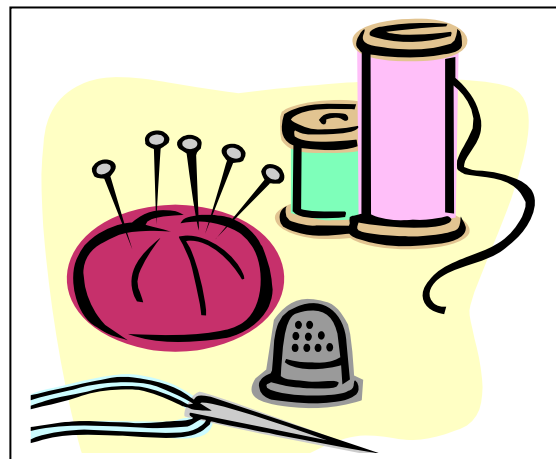

Quilts **must be** received no later than 7pm on Monday, Sept 17th.

Object of the workshop:

During the workshop students will learn:

- How to maintain your Featherweight 221 (or 222) yourself.
- How to get rid of the smell that some Featherweight cases acquire. .
- How to inspect the Featherweight 221 sewing machine for potential problems and how to correctly rectify any problems found.
- What tools are needed to work on a Featherweight. It only takes a few very basic and common tools, but having the right sized tool is important.
- Where to get parts at a fair price, quickly.
- Tips on purchasing a Featherweight.
- The answer to: "What is the value of my Featherweight?"

Supplies to bring with you:

Bring your **Featherweight** model 221/222 sewing machine (in working order) and its case, plus any attachments you may have. Also bring an old **towel**, some **thread** and a few **fabric scraps** to sew on for testing your tensions. That's it! Tools and lubricant to work with will be provided. **One Featherweight per person during class, please.**

NOTE: This is a full five hour workshop. The last hour of the workshop (or as needed) is open for particular problems/questions you may have that are unique to your machine. This is also a good time to go beyond the general scope of the workshop and discuss the restoration of the paint and decals on your machine. This restoration discussion can cover the repair of paint chips to the complete repainting of the Featherweight if students desire. Questions on additional Featherweights can be addressed after class, if time permits.

Purchase of the manual is highly recommended prior to class.

Workshops Continued

Borders of the Quarter Series

The 3rd Border of the Quarter Workshop is scheduled to be held Sunday, August 19, 2007 at the Attic Window. Session A is scheduled from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM; Session B is scheduled from 1:30 PM – 4:30 PM. Jill Therriault will instruct students how to make pieced borders from the scraps of fabrics leftover from the construction of the quilt top. The pieced border technique that will be the focus of the workshop requires easy rather than precise measurements to create stunning pieced borders which appear to float on a background border to accent the top.

Students need to come to the workshop with the following items:

- A project to which you will apply a border, i.e., a top; a pieced medallion such as that used in progressive quilting projects; or a pre-printed panel. A piece of fabric to which the feature border will be added to can be substituted for a top.
- Leftover scraps of fabric from constructing the blocks used to create the top or coordinating fabric(s);
- Rotary cutter, cutting mat, and rulers (special rulers may be required depending upon the specific border to be featured); and
- Basic quilting supplies including a sewing machine, thread, pins, marking tools, i.e. marking pencils, chalk markers, etc.

Cost: \$10 per workshop. Pre-registration and payment will be required at the time of registration for the workshop. A minimum of 8 students will be required for each workshop. Space is limited, so register early!
