Watercolor Quilts

I have known Marilyn Burchett now for about 5 years because of Bordering on the Edge (BOE) and the quilt Guild. This summer while at BOE, I noticed Marilyn working with small squares (something that is not unusual for her), but somehow this was different. A few conversations later and a show and tell of her recent creations had me fascinated about these watercolor quilts and what goes into making one. My head was exploding with questions about this wonderful craft! What do you need, is there a set pattern, grid, colorway, etc? More, more, I needed to know more! Marilyn was a wealth of information who uses her own "map" or grid, but you may purchase one and even kits to help get you started. Some of her tips: Use of florals, use a Ruby Beholder when value comes into question. (just Google it) Don't go bigger with florals because you will actually have color loss so be watchful. Reversing the fabric using the backside for that perfect "light" tone when needed.

Basics are fabrics and layout:

- 1,2 & 3 are light
 - 4,5,6 are medium to light
 - 7,8,9,10 (that has dark areas)
 - 11,12,13,14,15 are medium to dark
 - 16 is the darkest
- Marilyn's "sample" grid





Techniques are wool applique & Sashiko stitching.




Dog Day Blues

Pumpkin Cornbread (gluten free)

350° About 35 minutes

Dry ingredients: 1 1/2 c. cornmeal, 1 c. brown rice flour

1 Tbsp. baking powder, 3/4 tsp sea salt

Wet ingredients:

1 c. pumpkin puree, 1 c. milk (almond works)

1/3 c. melted coconut oil or butter

1/3 c. honey, 2 lg eggs

Oil a 7x11 in glass baking dish.

In medium bowl, whisk together the dry ingredients. In a

separate large bowl, whisk together the wet ingredients. Pour the dry into the wet and whisk together well. Scoop batter

into oiled baking dish and spread it out evenly with the back of a spoon.

Let cool slightly before serving. Yields: 8-10 servings

Avocado anyone?



Ingredients

- 1 Tbsp. olive oil, 1 can (15 oz.) no salt added black beans, 1 can (8.75 oz.) whole kernel corn, 1 pkg Knorr® Ready to Heat Spanish Style Rice, 2 avocados, 2 green onions, 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Directions

Heat olive oil in large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat. Drain and rinse canned black beans and corn. Add to skillet and cook with Knorr® Ready to Heat Spanish Style Rice 5 minutes. While cooking, cut avocados in half and remove pits.

Slice scallions.

It is recommend slicing off a bit of the opposite side, so the half does not slide away when trying to cut into it, or better to slice the half.

Place avocado halves onto a platter. Spoon hot rice mixture evenly over avocado halves, allowing excess to fall onto platter. Evenly top with shredded cheese and sprinkle with sliced scallions. Serve with fresh lime wedges or hot sauce, if desired.

Bread of choice—toasted

1 ripe avocado mashed, adding salt & pepper to taste.

Options: Add eggs of your choice—poached, fried or scrambled.



Ingredients:

Bread of choice—toasted

1 ripe avocado, 1/2 lemon juiced

Sea salt & ground pepper to taste.

Mash avocado in bowl add lemon juice and salt and pepper.

Options: Add fresh herbs: basil, cilantro, parsley and spices like crushed red pepper, cumin or paprika.
