# Liz Hemberry, President

Hi everyone! We are fast approaching the end of 2023. This has been a great year with a successful quilt show, great meetings and beautiful quilts being made. Also coming up is the Fall retreat at Campbell's. I look forward to this one every year and it looks like we will have a full house. I am already setting aside projects to work on. It's not easy because I have a lot of UFO's to choose from.

- According to data collected, the average quilter is a woman in her 60s who is retired and has a household income of \$65k+. 17.5% of average quilters have full-time jobs. The average quilter today is comfortable with technology, has been quilting for over 10 years, and starts 10-12 quilt projects each year, mostly lap quilts or queen-sized quilts, in a traditional style. The average quilter spends more than six hours per week working on quilting projects.
- In the United States and Canada, 85 million creatives account for \$35 billion in sales.
- The quilting industry anticipates approaching \$5 billion by 2026-27, indicating stable and solid growth.
- The average quilter started her first quilt in her 50s when there was time, space, and income to quilt.
- The average quilter is still driven by women in their 60s.
- There are an estimated 30 million active sewists (a slight decrease from the peak of the pandemic).
- Digital learning is in high demand through both YouTube and other digital media.
- Quilters utilize social media daily for connecting but still prefer being in-person.

This survey made me feel good. Looks like quilting is here to stay and in fact should increase. Part of the survey showed most quilters start in their 50's and the number of women approaching 50 increases each year.

The budget is due for review. If you are a board member, or committee chair person, we need to know what your budget needs will be for next year. I am trying to find a place for a board meeting to be held on October 18<sup>th</sup>. Set that date aside if you plan to attend.

The October meeting program will be the Longarmers' Round Robin. Hope to see you there. Louise is working on the end of year quilt meeting (November) and will be asking quilt winners to bring their quilts for sharing. The last meeting will also be when we vote for new board members. Still needed are President, Vice President and Assistant Treasurer.

# Comfort Quilts, Sue Nash

Wow! We have taken in nearly 200 completed quilts so far in 2023. Our most common donations are palliative sizes (approximately 40" x 60"), with twins not far behind (60" x 80"). Many people do tops, which we try to match up with donated backing fabrics and binding to make kits that are ready to be quilted. These can be completed as simply as you like or fancier if you have a machine to accommodate them. Often we have quilts ready to add binding which can be done completely by machine or finished by hand. Check out projects at our table each meeting. If you are working on a donation quilt and would like batting, just contact one of us and we will get it cut for you to pick up or bring it to a meeting.

Each Christmas, CASA likes to get pillow cases for foster kids. Please take a few kits at a meeting or use scraps to make some from scraps in your stash. There are many sites with directions. Search BURRITO STYLE PILLOW CASE VIDEO. We will need your completed pillow cases at the November meeting.

Another good use for scraps is to make place mats (no larger than 12" x 18") which we donate to Mobile Meals. They report that recipients appreciate the colorful addition to their meal delivery. Some fun Christmas/holiday place mats would brighten the lives of many shut-ins during what may be a lonely time.
