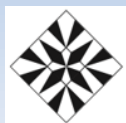

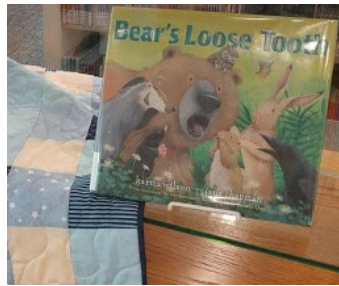
Slice of Pi Quilts ~ From a recent Blog Quilts go to the library!

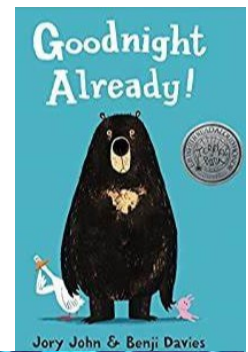

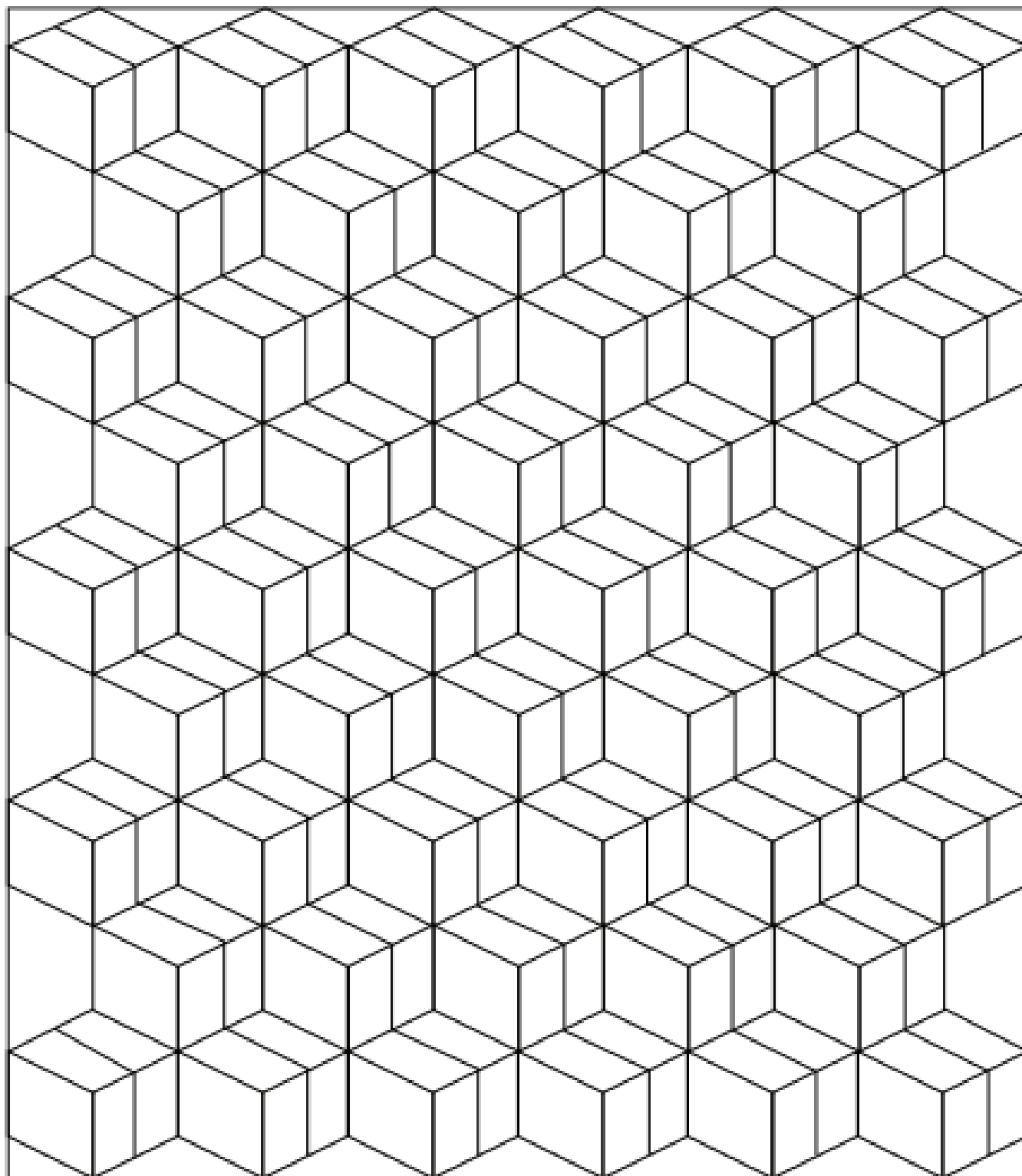

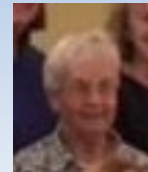

Thank you to everyone that continued to make and donate comfort quilts during the shutdown. We gave out 100 quilts in 2020 and 53 so far this year. In addition to the 3 quilts per month we give to Palliative care, we also donated to The Bunker for wheelchair bound vets, CASA, Women's Resource, Grace House, Sage and 11 quilts to a Tiny House Project in Okanogan. We welcome suggestions for future donations.

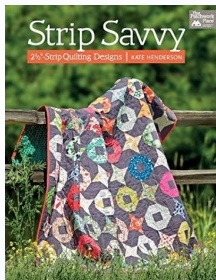

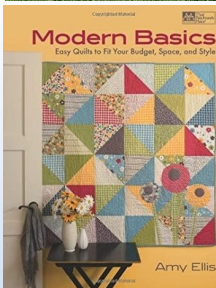

RECIPES



Beef n Broccoli

Ingredients: Broccoli head, 2 tsp sesame oil (or to taste), 1-2 Tbsp vegetable oil, 2 pounds sirloin steak, sliced thinly, 1 large sliced onion, 2 clove minced garlic, 2 tsp grated ginger, 6 Tbsp Tamari or Soy Sauce, 2 Tbsp Hoisin sauce, 2 Tbsp brown sugar, 2 tsp chili sauce, 2 Tbsp cornstarch, 3/4 cup beef broth 1/2 cup sliced scallions.

Directions 1. Blanch broccoli florets and drain. Next, Heat oil in large sauté pan & lightly brown beef in batches and remove. Sauté sliced onions, garlic and ginger for about 3 minutes. Then add 1/2 cup broth, sesame oil, soy sauce, hoisin sauce, brown sugar, chili sauce and stir to combine. Next, make cornstarch slurry with remaining broth, slowly add to simmering sauce until desired consistency is achieved. Add blanched broccoli & meat to pan & stir. Garnish with scallions and serve with rice or noodles of choice.



Dalgona Coffee is Korean whipped coffee. This recipe creates a frothy iced coffee drink.

2 Tbsp Instant Coffee
2 Tbsp Sugar
2 Tbsp boiling water
1 c. Milk, or half and half, or other

milk substitute—we will use this last.
Ice Makes 2 servings.

Start ~ Mix instant coffee, sugar, and hot water into a bowl, whisk together, once sugar is dissolved whip with an electric mixer until stiff peaks form. The mixture will be shiny & resemble a whipped meringue.

Next ~ In a large mason jar or oversized cup. Mix ice, milk, and Dalgona Coffee mixture, shake/stir until well mixed. Pour into serving glasses. Makes 2 strong, frothy, icy delicious coffee drinks! Milk to coffee mix can be adjusted to taste.

***TIPS:** Keep ratio 1:1:1 for coffee, sugar, and hot water if increasing or decreasing recipe.

3-2-1 Cake Mix



Instructions

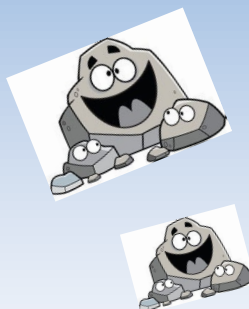
Mix Angel Food cake mix and your choice of cake mix (lemon, devils' food, etc)
Put both boxes of cake mix in a zip lock bag or plastic container (for easy access & storage) and mix well.
Ready for your easy treat?

Use a microwavable cup, mug or ramekin
Add 3 Tablespoons cake mixture
Add 2 Tablespoons of water
... Mix well ...
Microwave for 1 minute
Add extra goodness ~ Cool Whip, ice cream= enjoy!

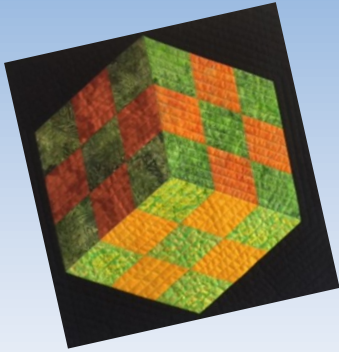

Tip: Don't make a big deal about how long it actually has been since your last confession, I mean, sewing machine service.



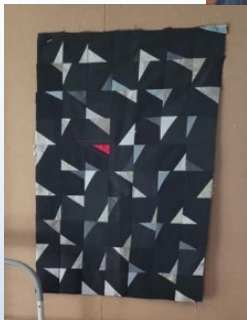
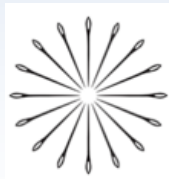
White glue! I dilute it like 10 parts water to 1 part glue and paint it on cotton before using. Let it dry (blow dryer helps), iron, and use. Seems to stop fraying.

Bias on the Bottom (BOB). The bias should be on the bottom (next to the feed dogs) of the two pieces being sewn. It is the presser foot that will do the stretching
