Please do not go out and buy fabric for these workdays. The goal is to use scraps. Some fabrics will be provided if your don't have scraps to use (who would be in that situation?). Plan to make as many blocks as you want.

The final two meetings for 2025 were/are:

Nov. 7: Terri Dunscomb let the fearless group (thank you!) while Diane was at the Chelan retreat. Using the 100 plus blocks donated to BOM, the group put together 7 palliative and 1 twin-sized quilts! Great job everyone and especially Terri.

Dec. 5: Diane is planning on using 6 and a half inch 9-patch blocks to make "houses" with a flying goose block for the "roof". Fabric will be on hand, however, if you have any orphaned 6.5 blocks of any pattern, bring them along and they can be used to create a "house" block.
