MID-YEAR BUDGET REVIEW


July 1, 2015

Income and expense reports were provided to eight members in attendance (a quorum was met) as a mid-year review. A lengthy discussion took place to decide how to shepherd the recent \$7,500.00 donation to the Guild from the hospital foundation.

Discussion topics:

- Some expense line-items in the budget may need increasing by the end of the year. If so, we have the funds to cover an increase. This also helps set a better base line for the finance committee when they meet on next year's budget.
- Secure separate storage space for community/comfort quilts. This will provide more space for future years quilt show boutique items, archives and keeping historical information. Costs will continue to be paid via the general fund.
- Looking at re-vamping community/comfort quilt sew-in dates. Possibly at the Masonic Temple and looking at Saturdays.
- Considering a new / revised sub-contracting structure for longarmers for quilting services. This may involve creating 1099 forms and different IRS reporting requirements for both subcontractor and the Guild. We'll see more information in the upcoming newsletter.
- Kathy Keagle made a motion that the \$7,500.00 donation from the hospital foundation be placed in the general fund. Arlene Crumrine seconded and the motion passed.

Community / Comfort Quilts

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Your Committee members:

Debra Egan, Kathy Keagle and Jill Therriault

This past month the Community Quilts Committee has provided the following quilts to the community:

1 – Habitat for Humanity 1 – Parkside Apartments Project 8 – Palliative Care Program

We are in the process of getting the information needed to give quilts to the 29 families that lost their homes in this past tragic Sleepy Hollow fire. We should be able to fulfill the additional 2 quilts needed for the Parkside Apartments shortly.

Also, we are working on satisfying the needs of Our House Cancer Care Facility. Their quilts dearly need replacing as they have been well loved, used and laundered. They have requested 10 twin-size quilts (60x90) and 1 queen size. These quilts need to be large enough to cover the mattress with an overhang long enough to touch the box springs.

The Grief Place has been promised 8-10 quilts for their Children's Grief Group which starts in the fall. The quilts will need to be appropriate for 6-12 year olds.

Just to name a few, but not limited to, the other organizations who we donate the wonderful quilts you make are the Women's Resource Center, the Wellness Place, CWH Pediatric Department, Chief of the Day Program, State Patrol and to such nonprofit organizations as the Literacy Guild, Humane Society and the Wenatchee Museum for their auctions to raise funds they need to stay in business for the community. However, not only do we give to organizations in the area we also give quilts to comfort individuals who are in need be it due to illness, surgeries or tragedies. So please, please, please keep those quilts coming!!!

We are trying to line up the Masonic Hall for a sew-in on Saturday, July 18th. Please "*pencil*" it on your calendars. We will let you know the details as soon as we know if it is a "*yea or nay*" and ask for a list of those who plan to attend. Also, a reminder will be sent out and depending on the number of positive rsvp's that we receive, the sew-in on Tuesday, July 21st, will or will not take place. We will provide lunch for either or both of the sew days that take place.

As you might know, we have many, many tops in storage that need to be completed into the final product a quilt we can donate!

So on that note.....

The Community/Comfort Quilts Committee is actively seeking a long arm quilter who is a Guild member to be dedicated to quilting up to 10 quilts a month. While we have had success with our contracted quilters we find a need for more consistent production. We believe a single source to provide the majority of our quilting needs will be most beneficial to the guild. The other contracted quilters will be available to fill-in as needed.

This job will probably result in an income of approximately \$400-\$500/month. The expected turn-around time will be 30 days. The guild will issue a service contract and provide a 1099 IRS form at end of the year, if necessary. The quilter will be responsible for all taxes on wages, and the position offers no extra privileges or benefits.

Our requirement of pantograph or attractive meandering/simple stippling is still on plan. We hope that you will consider this opportunity and send notification to the committee for review.

Quilter of the Quarter, Liz Hemberry



The North Central Washington Quilt Guild proudly introduces you to our featured Quilter of the Quarter, Liz Hemberry. We hope to help you get to know some of your fellow members.

Liz started quilting in the early 1970's. Both her grandmother and mother quilted, so she grew up with quilts in her life. In fact, she never had a blanket! Liz made her first quilt in high school to take with her when she moved out on her own.

When asked who her favorite quilt artist was, she was perfectly clear – Jinny Beyer was her pick. She loves all of her designs and can pick out one of her quilts in a line-up, no problem. They just jump out at her. If she could pick a quilter to spend the day with it would be Jinny Beyer.

Liz's current favorite project is a wedding ring variation called “Wedding Star”, by Judy Niemeyer, and though she prefers Strip Piecing to Paper Foundation Piecing, she is enjoying this technique on this project. Like all of us, she has a project looming over her; it is a quilt top from her mom that is hand pieced spools. Liz plans to hand quilt it but is having problems finding the time to get started.

For Liz, the greatest challenge in her quilting right now is picking out the perfect color combinations. She has quilt patterns that she has spent 5 years looking for just the right materials to begin.

Liz has been helping her daughter in law with a wall hanging for her own mom and she is an advocate for finding someone to help get started in this craft we all love. Since her daughter in law has not only never quilted, but never even sewn, Liz's advice is, start at the very basics. With Liz's help she is now ready to start quilting on her project. Liz allowed her to make mistakes so they could work together to fix them and she has learned so much. Her mom is going to love her quilt.

Thanks to Liz for sharing her quilting story.



The following procedures are for your protection. Please honor them.

1. A receipt must be presented in order to pick up each item.
2. Items must be picked up between 5:45 and 6:30 p.m., Saturday, September 12th.
- 3. No items will leave prior to the stated time, or without a receipt.**
4. No one other than authorized personnel will be allowed into the Quilt Show area while items are being prepared for return.
5. If you are unable to pick up your quilt, please make arrangements to have someone pick it up for you. **(They must have the receipt.)** Mailing of items to their owner will not be available.

Policies - and - Procedures

POLICIES

Vendors must be quilt guild members. We are asking each person to work a shift in the booth during the show. Shifts will be two hours long. We will be passing a sign-up sheet around at the next meeting.

- Pricing must be on guild tags which we will provide.
- Prices must be in 50 cent increments and cannot be changed during the show.
- Items cannot be picked up before the end of the show. Each member is responsible for setting the price on their items.
- It is suggested that if you have an item that is not easily recognizable that you make a tasteful small sign to go with it.
- If you are bringing in a medium to large size quilt, we suggest that you have a photo of the quilt attached to it. Large items will be folded so it would help to have a photo to show the whole quilt if someone is interested in it.

PROCEDURES

- Members wishing to sell items must collect tags and inventory sheets at the July or August meeting.
- Items for sale will be collected at the quilt show "take in" on Sunday and Monday, September 6th and 7th. Paperwork is to be filled out and tags attached to items before bringing to take in. We ask that you **DO NOT** use straight pins to attach tags. Small safety pins or ribbons will work. Tags will have a small hole in the corner so they could be tied on.
- The inventory sheets may be photo copied if you have a lot of items. If you need more of the tags, contact Barbara Vincent or Judy West and we will get more to you. These tags will have a tear-off portion so they cannot be photocopied. Completed inventory sheets will be kept in a file and used to check off sold items and calculate payment after the show.
- Unsold items will be taken into the quilt show pick-up area and can be picked up following the closing of the show.
- Checks for the sold items will be mailed out within two weeks of the show. Please do not expect payment at the close of the show!
