Guild Activities

Quilt Show

The annual Harvest of Quilts, held every September, is the Guild's biggest event of the year. The two-day show is an opportunity to display the work of the Guild's members to the community.

Retreats

Retreats are held yearly, in the spring and fall, generally May and November. These three-day weekend retreats are the perfect opportunity to get away and spend quality time with your sewing machine and quilting buddies!

Round Robins

These are smaller groups - mini-guilds, if you will - that meet on a regular basis to sew together. Each group decides their own schedule, projects, etc.

Comfort Quilts

NCWQG makes quilts as gifts of friendship or comfort for others in the community. Comfort quilts may also be given to a non-profit community group to use as fundraiser. Many organizations in the Valley have been and are beneficiaries of these quilts.

Block of the Month

At each general meeting, a block pattern is offered for members to pick up and complete before the next meeting. Turning in a block entitles the maker to entry in a drawing for the all the completed blocks.
