

Notes From the Librarian, Sharon Paine



Choose the Your Books tab which will pull up the books in the library. You browse through the title or you can do a search.


**To Search:** Type search terms into Search Your Library box Click on Search You will get a list. Click on title to see details, summary, and reviews.



#### Recipe—- Cowboy Cavier


With you, our very generous guild members, we have been able to make and donate beautiful quilts to many very needy and de4serving recipients.
