January Program:

The January General Membership meeting (Wednesday, January 17, 6:00 p.m. at Pybus). The program is going to be the Round Robin Dare Devils' presentation of their 2023 Quilt Show Challenge, "The Mighty Columbia River". Eleven Dare Devil members participated in the challenge, designing and creating their perception of a small portion of the river. The only requirements were a maximum quilt width of 18", to use some of the provided river fabric, manipulated any way they chose, and maintaining the designated river width on each side. The variety of styles and techniques adds to the uniqueness and joy of this project. Members will discuss how the project came about and how each quilt represents the individual creator

and yet ties together with all the other pieces. This should be a very fascinating discussion. Be sure to attend. Check out our website to see the 2023 quilt gallery to see pictures of all the entries at NCWquilt.org.


